Peer-to-Peer (P2P) mobile payment services, such as Venmo, Zelle and Cash App are great tools to transfer money to friends and family. However, with their growing popularity comes a greater opportunity for fraudulent behavior. Follow these best practices to keep your finances safe when utilizing P2P apps to send or deposit money.

### **Never Send Money to Receive Money**

 Never agree to send someone money or make a purchase in return for a payment or reward.

### Only Send Funds to People you Know

• It may seem convenient to use P2P apps to pay for goods found on online marketplaces. However, scammers pretend to be interested buyers to have you send them a payment to verify your identity. To avoid this, only send payments to people you know and trust and verify their username is correct.

#### Know the Rules

• If you participate in giveaways or sweepstakes, understand the rules of the contest and verify the legitimacy. An authentic giveaway will never request that you send cash to them to receive the prize.

#### Set up Security Features

• Utilize the security functions the P2P app provides such as setting a PIN, enabling two-factor authentication and email or text notifications.

### Report it

• If you think you have sent money to a scammer, report the scam to the P2P app and ask for them to reverse the transaction immediately. Also, report it to the Federal Trade Commission at reportfraud.ftc.gov.

To assist members in protecting their identity, CCU offers two identity theft products that provide early detection in the event of a breach, monitors your personal data and helps restore your identity if compromised. For more information, visit coopcu.com.

Co-op Credit Union employees received CPR with Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Training with Instructor Steve Collins from Western Technical College.

The hands-on training provided employees with the knowledge on how to respond to any cardiac or breathing emergency that may arise while at work or in their personal lives. Participants used a mannequin to administer CPR and worked as a team to apply the AED. Co-op Credit Union is equipped with AEDs at every location and is fully trained in their use.

"I really enjoyed learning how to administer CPR with Steve," said Brooke Aldach, CCU's Mortgage Lending Officer. "As someone who regularly meets with our members, I am more at peace knowing that I have been equipped with the tools and knowledge to save someone's life in a crisis."
